Submission guidelines

To submit a proposal for a workshop, please send email to <u>ismar11workshops@gmail.com</u> with a **PDF** document containing:

- 1. Name of workshop and proposed URL of site to host CFP, program etc.
- 2. Theme of the workshop and topics of interest and how these relate to the overall conference
- 3. Preliminary Call for Papers
- 4. Names, affiliations, research interest, and a short bio (up to 200 words) of the organizers
- 5. Brief description (up to 1 page) of research issues that the workshop will address
- 6. Reasons why the workshop is of interest to the conference participants
- 7. Audience: expected number of participants, potential program committee members

After sending email, you should get a notification that your email has been received.

Potential workshop organizers should also note that:

- 1. Workshop organizers are expected to register for the ISMAR11 conference.
- 2. One free registration per workshop is given. The information on the free registrant has to be provided to the Workshop Chair by October 1st.
- 3. Workshop organizers are assumed to use their own submission management (e.g. easychair).

Organizers are expected to be active themselves in the field where they propose a workshop. Organizers are required to attend those workshops they are organizing. Any change to the workshop organization team must be submitted in writing at least two weeks prior to the paper deadline for individual workshop. No changes to the workshop organization team can be made after this date to ensure that potential participants submitting position papers to workshops are aware of the final organization team.
